- **Task 2:** Answers will vary, but should include five of the following:
 - •Lubricate body hinges and latches, key lock cylinders, folding seat hardware, and sunroof.
 - •Brake system inspection.
 - •Change engine oil and filter. Reset oil system.
 - •Engine air cleaner filter inspection.



- •Engine coolant level check.
- •Engine cooling inspection. Visual inspection of pipes, fittings, and clamps if needed.
- •Exhaust system and nearby heat shields inspection for loose and damaged components.
- •Fluid visual leak check.
- •Fuel system inspection.
- •Restraint system component check.
- •Steering and suspension inspection.
- •Tire inflation pressure check.
- •Tire wear inspection.
- •Windshield washer fluid check.
- •Windshield wiper blade inspection for wear, cracking or contamination.
- •Tire rotation.
- •Sunroof track and seal inspection, if equipped.
- Task 3:Answers will vary, but should include five of the following:
 - Accelerator pedal check for damage, high effort or binding.
 - Automatic transmission shift lock control function.
 - Ignition transmission lock check.
 - Park brake and p (park) mechanism check.
 - Starter switch check.
 - Underbody flushing service (recommended every Spring to remove dust, dirt and chemicals used for snow & ice removal).
 - Hood/decklid/liftgate/liftglass support gas strut service.
 - If the vehicle has a tire sealant and compressor kit, check the sealant expiration date printed on the instruction label of the kit.
- Task 4:When the CHANGE ENGINE OIL SOON message displays, service is required for the vehicle as
soon as possible, within the next 1 000 km/600 miles.
