Task 1: List five (5) concerns about AI that are addressed in one or both of the articles.

Answer: Any five of

- ChatGPT users had lower brain engagement than those not using Chat CPT, as measured by an EEG
- ChatGPT users consistently underperformed at neural, linguistic and behavioural levels
- Over the course of several months, ChatGPT users got lazier with each subsequent essay, often resorting to copy-and paste by the end of the study
- The more time users spend talking to ChatGPT, the lonelier they feel
- EEGs showed low executive control and attentional engagement
- Students relying on AI show poorer performance on tests and demonstrate poorer critical thinking skills (e.g. problem-solving abilities)
- "AI-induced skills decay" refers to the over-reliance on AI tools and the erosion of skills humans typically rely on to solve problems. This can lead to mental atrophy
- Over-reliance on AI can lead to poor judgment, as decisions are delegated to AI
- Writing using AI does not encode into memory the same way that writing without it does; this leads writers to remember little of their own writing when it was completed with AI assistance

Task 2: The Forbes article distinguishes between tools like Excel spreadsheets and the use of AI. In your own words, explain why the authors believe AI tools have a different effect on human thinking.

Answer: The authors' observation is that previous tools (such as Excel) assist with things like calculations and analysis, but they still rely on human thinking to determine which formulas to use or which information to analyze. There is a level of comprehension and decision-making that is undertaken by the user. In contrast, AI tools are effectively "outsourcing" human thinking and do not require us to understand what we are calculating or analyzing. There is concern that, over time, reliance on AI tools will weaken our cognitive skills.

Task 3: The conclusion of the Forbes article is: "By maintaining a careful balance between technological advancement and cognitive skills, we can ensure that AI enhances, rather than diminishes, our human potential". Write an opinion paragraph of at least 10 sentences explaining why you believe it is possible, or not possible, to maintain this "careful balance".
