- If you need proof of high school equivalency to find a job, pursue studies in college, or to apply for an apprenticeship.
- You live in Ontario and have been a resident for at least 6 months.

# Task 2: List the five sections of the CAEC assessment. Include the format and length of time for each testing section.

- Reading: 50 questions in 75 minutes
- Science: 35 questions in 75 minutes
- Writing: 1 persuasive writing test in 75 minutes
- Social Studies: 40 questions in 75 minutes
- Mathematics: 12 questions in 30 minutes (no calculator); 30 questions in 90 minutes (calculator): 120 minutes total

# Task 3: What is the minimum score required to pass the CAEC assessment?

### Task 4: How much does it cost to register for the CAEC test?

# Task 5: List the five eligibility requirements for writing the CAEC assessment.

- You do not have an Ontario High School Diploma
- You are not currently registered with an Ontario school
- If Homeschooled: must wait 1 year from 18<sup>th</sup> birthday to register
- You have been a resident of Ontario for at least 6 months
- You are 18 years or older and have been out of school for at least one year
