Task 1: List three things that are required when booking a road test.

Answer: Any three of

- have met the mandatory wait periods
- have enough experience
- have a driver's licence number
- have the ability to pay the fees
- if in the graduate licensing program, you may not book a road test after the driver's licence expiry date

Task 2: If you are preparing for a Class G road test (highway test), what you must declare about your past highway driving experience and what happens if you try to take your test without providing this information.

Answer: You must declare how many times in the last three months that you have driven on a highway with a speed limit of at least 80 km/hr and/or a 400-series highway. To qualify, you must have driven at least five times on one or some of these roadways in the last three months. You also must indicate the average length of these trips (i.e., under 5 km, between 5 and 15 km, over 15 km). Please ensure that you have the required highway driving experience, or your appointment will be cancelled and you will lose 50% of your road test fee.

Task 3: How early should you arrive on the day of your road test?

Answer: Arrive at least 30 minutes early.

Task 4: List four things you must bring with you to your road test.

Answer: Any four of

- vehicle in good working order
- glasses or contact lenses (if you need to wear them to drive)
- enough gas in the vehicle to take the test

- current driver's licence
- print-out out of your road test confirmation email
- money for test fees (if you are hoping for a standby road test appointment)

Task 5: How long is a temporary driver's licence valid when you receive it after successful completion of your road test?

Answer: Valid for 90 days or until your permanent driver's licence photo card arrives in the mail.
