Answer: "the wind is blowing" "the wind blows back the snow"

Task 6: What happens when the plow cleans up the street?

Answer: The wind blows back the snow.

Task 7: What season is it in this poem?

Answer: winter

# Task 8: What do you think will happen next in this poem?

Answers will vary. The learner might describe the ongoing cycle of the snowplow removing snow and wind continuing to blow it back. The learner may describe the end of the storm and the final pass by of the snowplow, or the end of winter and melting of snow.
