Answers will vary but should match the list of stores given in Task 1.

Task 3: Plan your route by drawing lines between the stores you will visit, starting and ending at the "You are Here X" point in the map. If possible, you want to find the shortest route between all the stores. You do not want to walk back and forth through the mall multiple times.

Answers will vary. The route selected should be straightforward and connect all the stores the learner has identified.

Task 4: You plan to arrive at the mall at 9am. It will take 5 minutes to walk from the parking lot to the first store. You want to spend 10 minutes in each store. It will take approximately 5 minutes to walk from one store to the next. What time will you finish your shopping and return to your car?

Answers will vary depending on the route the learner has chosen. A sample timeline is as follows. Based on the time requirements, the learner should arrive at their car at 11am.

9:00am-9:05am: walk from parking lot to first store

9:05am-9:15am: Look for digital camera at electronics store 9:15am-9:20am: Walk from electronics store to lighting store 9:20am-9:30am: Look for desk lamps 9:30am-9:35am: Walk from lamp store to chocolate store 9:35am-9:45am: Look for chocolates 9:45am-9:50am: walk from chocolate store to toy store 9:50am-10:00am: look at toys 10:00am-10:05am: walk from toy store to clothing store 10:05am-10:15am: look for tie 10:15am-10:20am: walk from clothing store to sport store 10:20am-10:30am: look for running shoes 10:30am-10:35am: walk from sport store to card store 10:35am-10:45am: look at birthday cards
