Learner Information

In addition to OW and ODSP, there may be financial supports available to assist low-income residents with certain types of health expenses.

Read "Help with Health-Related Expenses for Low-Income Residents".

Help with Health-Related Expenses for Low-Income Residents

Funds may be available to pay for certain medically based items/services such as eyeglasses, emergency dental work, medication, medical items (walkers, hearing aids, hospital beds and more) or funeral expenses. Lowincome Toronto residents who are not receiving assistance from Ontario Works, Emergency Assistance or the Ontario Disability Support Program (ODSP) can apply regardless of their immigration status in Canada.

If you are not receiving social assistance, you can apply to see if you qualify for help with health-related expenses. It is important that you apply before paying for your medical items/services, as you may not be reimbursed for some items/services if you have already paid for them.

Who Can Apply

Low-income Toronto residents, who are not receiving assistance from Ontario Works/Emergency Assistance or ODSP, who require help with a medically based item/service, may apply.

How to Apply

To apply, call 416-338-8888 (select option #3). You will need to provide information about your financial situation and have details and a cost estimate for the medically based item/service you need. It is important that you apply before paying for your medical items/services, as you may not be reimbursed for some items/services if you have already paid for them.

If you do not speak English or French, you will need an interpreter when you call to apply. For help finding an interpreter, visit 211Toronto.

After Applying

Your eligibility will depend on the cost of the medically-based item/service you need, whether or not that item/service qualifies for funding, and your financial situation.

Low-income residents who apply for help with the cost of health-related expenses will be told by the caseworker whether or not they qualify after all needed documents have been provided.
