Task Description: The learner will write sentences from dictation, review their work for errors, and read their work back to the practitioner.

Information for Practitioners/Instructors

The paragraph used in this task uses many words found in *Patterns in Spelling Book 1.*

Read "A Day at the Park" to your learner. Say one sentence at a time and have the learner write the sentence. Be sure to say each sentence twice while dictating. If the learner does not hear a word, they may ask you to repeat the word once before they begin to write. Allow the learner to use a dictionary if needed.

- Part of this activity is to use your memory skills so you'll need to remember the whole sentence. Your instructor will not be able to repeat it a third time.
- Repeat these steps for the entire paragraph (15 sentences).
- Check your work over for mistakes and correct any that you notice (you may use the dictionary to check spelling if you wish).
